In our local office, our main focus this summer will be continuing our work to stop the overuse of antibiotics on factory farms and defending our hard won environmental protections. We are also hiring for over 30 locations across the country (including LA, San Diego, Santa Cruz, and Santa Barbara) on a variety of campaigns, so we're not just looking for students who will be in the area this summer.

We are hiring summer staff for our office and have had many Cal students work for us in the past. Students often want to work for us over their summer break because they can get a job where they can make a big difference on an issue they care about as well as learn valuable political skills they can put on their resume. Many senior staff in our network got their start with us through summer jobs, such as UCB alums Kat Lockwood and Jenn Angstrom, the organizing directors for the student PIRGS in Oregon and California, respectively.
