Although we do not require research, we encourage students to become involved in their junior year especially those considering an Honors thesis.
- *** Students who are taking honors should enroll in the Honors seminar (H194AB, optional) and Honors thesis (H195AB, required). Other students may participate in 199 or internship opportunities.
