While Asians and Asian Americans have helped build America and contributed to culture around the world, until very recently mainstream storytelling from Hollywood has not reflected these contributions or included narratives of the Asian diaspora. We want to change this and create a pipeline of creatives from Cal to Hollywood.

Through our AAPI Media Creatives Fellowship, BCNM aims to transform both how entertainment careers are viewed by AAPI students, and how AAPI are viewed within the entertainment industry. Selected fellows will receive a summer stipend of \$1,500 plus mentorship from industry professionals. The funding will help fellows pursue their creative passions in media and entertainment over the summer. This may be through an internship at a Hollywood studio, developing a script or videogame, or auditioning for television and movie roles. Fellows will also receive valuable mentorship from industry leaders Jason Lin (Producer, Story Arch Pictures), Lacy Lew Nguyen Wright (Executive Director, Hillman Grad Foundation), and Laura Reddy (Manager, Range Media Partners), which will include four activities, such as lunches, 1-1 meetings, speaker events and more.

We want to build a network of AAPI Cal alumni in leadership positions in media who, by developing narratives that feature AAPI and encouraging greater diversity at all levels within studios and agencies, will fundamentally change the ecosystem of cultural production to be more reflective of the AAPI community at large.

Apply for Summer Undergraduate Research Fellowship (SURF), March 1

Any undergraduate within the College of Letters & Science with a minimum of a 3.0 GPA who is planning to write a thesis or produce a capstone project during the 2023-2024 academic year is eligible to receive \$5,000 to support eight weeks of summer research related to their proposed project.

In addition to funding, SURF fellows receive substantial mentorship and benefit from an array of workshops that expose them to different research-related skills and outputs. Although the program is competitive, students who propose a viable project and have the full support of a faculty mentor are very likely to receive funding.



Samvid Scholars

The Samvid Scholars Program provides financial support for graduate study and leadership development. Scholars receive \$50,000 for tuition and fees each year for two years in an eligible graduate program, two years of leadership development programming, and access to an active alumni community.

Voyager Scholarship (For Sophomores)

Application Deadline: March 22, 2023

The Voyager Scholarship (Obama-Chesky Scholarship for Public Service) awards \$50,000 to 100 young leaders to help them bridge divides and solve our biggest challenges. It also provides meaningful travel experiences to expand their horizons and a network of mentors and leaders to support them. Recipients also receive a \$10,000 stipend and free housing to pursue a summer work-travel experience between their junior and senior year of college, as well as a \$2,000 travel credit for the next ten years.

Eligibility Requirements

- Be a U.S. citizen, permanent resident, or an individual granted DACA status
- Plan to enroll full-time in their junior year of study at an accredited four-year college or university in the U.S. in Fall 2023. Eligible students are 1) finishing sophomore year in Spring 2023 (considered "juniors" based on the total number of earned credits at their institutions by Fall 2023), OR 2) transferring from a 2-year to a 4-year college for their 2023–24 junior academic year.
- Have a minimum GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale, or equivalent
- Have demonstrated a commitment to public service
- Plan to pursue a career in public service upon graduation

SURF - Summer Undergraduate Research Fellowship Program, March 1

The <u>Summer Undergraduate Research Fellowship Program</u>, otherwise known as "SURF", provides \$5,000 stipends to students carrying out substantial research projects over the summer months. There are two scholarships available: SURF L&S and SURF Rose Hills.

- **SURF L&S** provides stipends to UC Berkeley students who are currently enrolled in the College of Letters & Sciences with a minimum of a 3.0 GPA. These awards support the preparation of a senior thesis or capstone project.
- **SURF Rose Hills** supports both independent and faculty-led research projects in select STEM disciplines. Fellows must be US citizens with residency established in Southern California and have a minimum of a 3.0 GPA.

To support students applying to SURF, OURS is offering a number of <u>workshops</u> throughout the month of February that will help applicants prepare a strong research proposal. The deadline for the program is March 1, 2023 so students should get started on their applications today.

The Judith Lee Stronach Baccalaureate Prize, March 1

The Stronach Baccalaureate Prize supports recent Cal graduates to undertake a public service, creative, or community-based research project in the year following graduation (fall 22, spring and summer 23 graduates eligible). Recipients are awarded up to \$25,000 for projects that serve the public good and heighten awareness of social issues. Application deadline: Wednesday, March 1, 2023.
