

The Prodrome, Assessment, Research and Treatment (PART) Program is based out of the University of California, San Francisco Department of Psychiatry. The PART Program conducts research with adolescents and young adults who are at high risk for developing schizophrenia, as well as young people recently diagnosed with schizophrenia.
