I am with Casa de Esperanza, a non-profit in Houston, Texas. Casa de Esperanza provides residential care to children birth through six who are in crisis due to abuse, neglect, or the effects of HIV. Care is provided in our neighborhood by our Hands of Hope interns. Our interns, most of whom are recent college graduates, join us for a year of service (a twelve-month full-time post-graduation internship). Applicants wishing to complete shorter internships are considered



Freedom Fall 2020

Calling all students interested in politics and power-building!



Are you looking to make a political difference while learning valuable skills and earning academic credit this fall? We want to share **Freedom Fall 2020**, a unique opportunity to stay involved in politics while earning academic credit in the run-up to the extremely consequential November election. **To sign up, enroll in AAS 197.2 by searching for class #15133.**

Professor Saru Jayaraman (president of One Fair Wage) is leading Freedom Summer Fall 2020, a social movement, organizing, and voter engagement program this semester that builds upon her successful Freedom Summer 2020 campaign. This past summer, 150 students from all over the country engaged thousands of potential voters in Pennsylvania, Michigan, Florida, and New York.



This semester, join students from across Cal's campus in an effort to continue building the power and voice of low-wage worker voters who have been most impacted by the pandemic. Inspired by the original Freedom Summer in Mississippi, this program will allow you to participate in a field course (AAS 197.2) for up to 4 units of credit in which you will help organize low-wage workers to vote using One Fair Wage's nonpartisan voter engagement strategies. Here are some program details:

- You will be trained and supported by veteran professional organizers before you work with voters.
- There will be weekly check-ins, but you will earn credit by calling and building relationships with voters on your own schedule.
- Each unit of credit requires approximately 3 hours of work, so if you take the course for 3 units, you are committing to 8-10 hours of voter engagement a week.
- If you want to participate, but do not want or need the academic credit, you can do so. Please email reed.levitt@berkeley.edu to get signed up. (This option is open to volunteers beyond Cal, so feel free to share with friends and family outside the university!)

To participate in Freedom Fall 2020, enroll in AAS 197.2 by searching for class #15133. Please enroll as soon as you can so we can get you trained and engaging voters by the end of this week!

Student experiences from Freedom Summer 2020:

<u>Leslie Laredo, Florida team</u>: "I was able to connect with incredibly empathetic individuals - every single individual I managed to talk to spoke in the "we," knowing full well that they were not the only subminimal wage worker being discriminated against during the pandemic. Each person continuously stressed the need for reform so that it can help EVERYONE impacted. It was inspiring and grounding all at once."

<u>Courtney Mitchell, Michigan Team:</u> "I had a conversation with a mother of 6 from Detroit. She had six children, was without a car, and because of COVID, was without of a job. When it came time to ask her about signing up for a mail ballot, she was so excited because without a car and six children, showing up at the polls was nearly impossible for her. Talking with her was

memorable for me because her resilience was inspiring, and it was really awesome to know that I had possibly made an impact on her by sharing an easier way to vote."
